The festival officially opens on Tuesday, February 11 with a Seniors Expo at the Slim Dusty Centre from 10am to 2pm. Hosted by celebrity chef, Lyndey Milan, the expo will be a one-stop shop for seniors, providing access to over 30 exhibitors showcasing local services and resources.

Proudly supported by Council, Home Instead Senior Care Mid North Coast and Macleay Valley Village – Thompson Health Care, the festival's schedule is full to the brim with events. It will include music sessions, line dancing, craft workshops, sport workshops, high teas and much more.

What is the difference between Level 3 and Level 4 Water Restrictions?

Under Level 3, gardens and lawns can be watered using handheld hoses for a maximum of 10 minutes every second day between 4pm and 9am using the 'odds and evens' system. No sprinklers or soaker hoses can be used.

Residents can use buckets and trigger hose rinsing for washing cars, boats and trailers, limited to once a week.

Topping up of swimming pools is allowed by hand-held hose for a maximum of 10 minutes between 4pm and 9am on allocated 'odds and evens' days.

Under Level 4, all outdoor potable water use is banned. Residents can only use grey or rainwater on gardens. There is a total ban on sprinklers or garden irrigation systems. No car or boat washing is permitted (outboard motor flushing permitted day of use for 1 minute only), and swimming pool top ups are also banned.

Under both restrictions, the outdoor cleaning of windows, walls, roofs, gutters, driveways and paved areas is banned, unless required as a result of an accident, emergency or health hazard.

Community compliance is vital if we are to avoid a move to Level 4.

LEVEL 3: VERY HIGH



WASHING CAR, BOAT TRAILER, TRUCK OR CARAVAN

PERMITTED

Once a week in lieu of watering gardens and lawns on the 'odds and evens' calendar day matching your house number between 4pm to 9am using buckets on lawn or gravel ONLY. Use of commercial car wash

facility any time.

DANNED

Washing of vehicles on 31st of the month.

Use of hoses or pressure cleaners to wash cars, boats, trailers, trucks or caravans.



SWIMMING POOLS, SPA POOLS, PONDS & FOUNTAINS



GARDENS & LAWNS

Every second day using the 'odds and evens' calendar days matching your house number using hand held hose fitted with cut off trigger or control nozzle for max. of 10mins/day between 4pm-9am.

BANNED

Watering on 31st of month. ALL sprinklers, micro-sprinklers and irrigation systems.

PERMITTED

New pools may be filled only with the written consent of Council (limited to 2 per month).

> Topping up allowed by handheld hose only for 10mins max. and only between 4pm-9am on allocated "odds and evens" calendar days.

BANNED

Emptying/filling of existing pools.

MONITORING YOUR WATER USAGE IS **Easy**

Your water meter provides a quick and easy way of monitoring your household water consumption. Just follow these easy steps.



Step 1

Take an initial meter reading, noting the date and time.



Take a second reading on the eighth day around the same time of day as the initial reading.



Calculate your weekly usage by deducting the first reading from the second reading.

Step 4

Divide by the number of days to get your daily usage (7 in this instance).

Divide your daily usage by the number of people in your home to get litres per person, per day.



PERMITTED

Handheld hose fitted with cut off trigger or control nozzle or pressure cleaner used for health and/or safety reasons only, such as a result of an accident, fire, health hazard or other emergency.

BANNED

Hosing and pressure cleaning any hardstand area/driveway or use chemicals or cleaning products.



CLEANING WINDOWS, HOUSES, ROOFS & GUTTERS

PERMITTED

Buckets or pressure cleaners ONLY for health and safety reasons such as a result of an accident, fire, health hazard or other emergency.



BOAT MOTORS USED IN A SALTWATER ENVIRONMENT (INC. BOAT & TRAILER)

PERMITTED

Boat motors: Hand held hose or 'muffs' for 1min on a lawn or gravel area on day of use only.

Boat and trailer: Spot rinse with bucket and sponge on lawn or gravel area on day of use only.

NOTE: Full wash only limited to once a week using the "odds and evens" calendar days matching your house number.

BANNED

Watering on 31st of month. Use of hoses or pressure cleaners to wash boats and trailers.

BANNED

Hosing or pressure cleaning windows, houses, roofs or gutters.
