When you think about Kempsey Shire in 20 years time, what images come to mind?

Is it villages that have grown by a few thousand residents and have more services and businesses as a result? Is it our beautiful river, coast and hinterland thriving because of viable environmental protection?

The Community Strategic Plan (CSP) is the document that describes this long-term vision for the area, including the objectives and strategies to achieve that vision. It helps guide Council and other organisations, government agencies and businesses to understand what's important to the people of the Macleay.

Over the last 12 months Council has been conducting a review of our CSP. The review has considered the results from the annual Community Satisfaction telephone surveys and we've analysed more than 1500 responses from 20 different workshops and surveys conducted as part of our community engagement program in recent years. We've also been asking your opinion about the current vision, priorities and focus areas through

workshops, online surveys and a discussion document. Your feedback has meant four overarching expectations for the future have emerged:

- Living in a healthy environment that's resilient, where natural and built environments are protected for people, fauna and flora.
- Supporting an economy that provides employment and is sustainable over the long term.
- Helping our community to be connected, inclusive and culturally aware.
- Having local leadership that values accountability, transparency and community participation in its decision making.

The new version of the plan is due to go on public exhibition before the end of 2021.

MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

With summer on the horizon and a state-wide roadmap in place to allow COVID-19 restrictions to ease over coming weeks, we have high hopes for a safe and successful summer tourist season. Our coast and hinterland normally attract more than 685,000 visitors each year, with the tourism and hospitality services industry bringing \$147 million into our local economy. The lockdowns and restrictions on travel in NSW and across Australia have been incredibly challenging for our tourism businesses in

In recent weeks our community have really stepped up and taken advantage of the influx of COVID-19 vaccine availability to ensure we have a vaccine and safety rate comparable to anywhere else

Again, we have proven that the people of the Macleay are proactive and get in and help others. Being vaccinated not only decreases the severity of COVID-19 in individuals but reduces the impact on our health system and means all the locals who work in tourism and hospitality might have a chance of returning to a normal workload this summer.

Almost three years ago at our Community Catch-up in Willawarrin, residents told us they wanted to see more promotion of the area and an increase in tourism for the Upper Macleay.

A new campaign coordinated by Council and run in Australian Traveller aims to do just that. The digital campaign features places to stay, explore and eat in the Macleay Valley hinterland and is targeted to reach more than 600,000 subscribers - all keen to rediscover travel!

Before the visitors arrive, there's an opportunity in the next few weeks for locals to get out and explore our valley, discover the trails, the river and the rides and help our tourism industry to feel supported and ready for a brighter season.


To start the conversation, we've developed a discussion guide to ask what you think might work in our region, what stops you

MATOR PROJECTS UPDATE

It's all systems go at the Verge and Eden Streets Sporting Complex

Work is continuing apace at the Verge and Eden Streets Sporting Complex, including construction of the new running track and footpath, and installation of the base layer for the new netball courts.

Rankine Street renewal, Crescent Head

The renewal of Rankine Street at Crescent Head is well underway, with the recent construction of retaining walls and footpaths, to be followed by the installation of decking.

Stuarts Point Reservoir refurbishment complete

Council recently completed the refurbishment of the Stuarts Point Reservoir, which supplies water to Stuarts Point, Grassy



Head and Fisherman's Reach. Early detection of corrosion enabled Council to get the upper hand and recoat the reservoir's internal surfaces, guaranteeing the asset's viability for decades to come.

THE NEW HEART OF KEMPSEY CBD COMES TO LIFE

The wait for the revitalised Clyde Street car park and amenities is now over after works wrapped up on the almost \$1 million project, proudly funded by the Australian and NSW Governments in association with Council.

Council has recently completed major upgrades to Clyde Street, an essential

project to renew Kempsey's main shopping precinct that allows for safer pedestrian movements and easier traffic flow.

The previous ageing public toilets have been replaced with a new inclusive amenities block, a vast improvement with accessible toilets and a more inviting and family-friendly exterior.

Council wish to thank residents for continuing to support local businesses in the area and using nearby car parks as the works were carried out.

LIBRARY UPDATE

The upgrade of one of the Kempsey community's bestloved facilities, Kempsey Library, is underway and will last until the end of the year.

Council recently received a \$460,000 Public Library Infrastructure Grant from the NSW Government to undertake the refurbishment, which will include new bookable meeting rooms, quiet study pods, a youth space with gaming technology and a new children's area that will flow onto a deck and outdoor reading room.

Throughout the renovations, library visitors must enter through the rear of the building via the Council car

park, where some additional public parking spaces are available. Customers will be able to browse stock, make selections and use public computers for minimal printing needs, but won't have access to seating and lounging spaces. A click and collect service will operate, and access to all the books, movies and resources online remains unchanged.

Kempsey Library operates weekdays 10:00am until 5.30pm and Saturdays 9am until 12pm.
