While these occurrences are out of our control, we can all take comfort in the work being done to help us manage such incidents and prepare for them in the future.

Day in, day out, adversity after adversity, the community shows its strength and ability to bounce back.

We have experienced flooding this year already and it should be a comfort for you to know that, as an organisation,

we drop everything to provide 24-hour assistance to the community.

Our flood response teams work around the clock during these periods, checking river levels, flood mitigation infrastructure and road and bridge conditions and reporting important information to keep the community informed.

We also work with key agencies such as the State Emergency Service and NSW Police to monitor and manage evolving situations at the Emergency Operations Centre. It is here that incredible amounts of information are sent and processed to get a picture of what is taking place and predict further changes in the situation.

This is a multi-agency response in which we assist the lead agency, the NSW SES, supported by dedicated and amazing people in the community, driven to provide assistance in the best way possible.

I encourage you to become familiar with Council's website, Disaster Dashboard and Facebook page to ensure you can find accurate information in times of emergency.

HAVE YOU GOT A STOCKPILE OF PROBLEM WASTE AT YOUR HOME?

Many materials can be reused and recycled if processed correctly at either our Community Recycling Centre or Mobile Community Recycling Centre, which saves valuable landfill space.

The Mobile Community Recycling Centre operates on a schedule, regularly visiting towns across Kempsey Shire to make it easier for you to get rid of problem household waste.

Items you can drop off for free include:

- car batteries
- electronic waste
- fire extinguishers
- fluorescent globes and tubes
- gas bottles
- household batteries
- mobile phones for MobileMuster
- motor and other oils
- paint
- polystyrene
- printer ink and toner cartridges for Planet Ark
- smoke detectors.



You can also drop items off at the Community Recycling Centre, located at the Waste Management Centre on Crescent Head Road, during business hours.

Residents whose properties were affected by the 2019-20 bushfires and are yet to dispose of fire-affected materials on their property could be eligible for a free clean-up.

Operation Property Clean Up is a joint program between Kempsey Shire Council and Disaster Relief Australia.

The program will see professional contractors assist residents to

clear damaged fence lines and green waste such as fallen trees from their properties.




SHARE YOUR KIDS COLOURING IN?
