Managing Drought, Fire and Flood

This guide reflects the unique pressures placed on NSW producers before, during and after drought, fire and flood. It includes strategies and actions that farmers can consider to make informed decisions both for their business, and the wellbeing of them and the people around them. It also includes information on relevant resources from the NSW Department of Primary Industries and Local Land Services, practical information on feeding livestock, farm management and sustainable practices around soils, pastures, cropping and natural resources.



Three Day Sickness

Three day sickness (or Bovine Ephemeral Fever) continues to be seen in the central and southern parts of our region.

It is spread by biting insects and many animals may already have been exposed over the last few summers, and so will be immune now, but recent introductions may be susceptible.

Three day sickness, as the name implies, usually only lasts a few days before they recover but some heavier or well conditioned animals may be more at risk of becoming recumbent. Anti-inflammatory drugs reduce the fever and hasten the recovery in affected animals, so talk to your vet if you notice any sick or lame animals. A vaccine is also available for those more at-risk stock but needs to be given in advance of the risk period so that immunity is present before they get infected.






Complete Survey



School Students Broadband Initiative

Do you know about the Australian Government's School Student Broadband Initiative powered by NBN Australia? The program has been extended, giving new families until 31 December, 2024 to sign up. Act fast, and you could enjoy nearly two school years of free internet until 31 December, 2025!

Eligibility:

- Have a child living at home who is enrolled in an Australian school.
- Do not currently have an active NBN network internet service at home (having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility).
- Live in premises that can access the NBN network through a standard connection.
- Have not had an active NBN connection during the previous 14 days.
