


This pre-employment program is funded by the Australian and NSW government's Storm and Flood Industry Recovery Program.

It also includes information on relevant resources from the NSW Department of Primary Industries and Local Land Services, practical information on feeding livestock, farm management and sustainable practices around soils, pastures, cropping and natural resources.

Rural Aid Farm Recovery Event

This Rural Aid event is bringing a team of volunteers to the Kempsey Shire to help farmers recover from last year's bushfires.

Three dozen volunteers will work across half a dozen farms on a range of recovery tasks.

Rural Aid's Farm and Community Coordinator Grant Miskimmin said farmers who haven't registered with Rural Aid yet were welcome to get in touch.

"Rural Aid is really excited to head to Willawarrin between March 3 and 9," Mr Miskimmin said, "We've already lined up a few famers whose property we can work on. We've planned some fencing and other-fire related repairs for those farms.

"But we have room for a few more famers; so if you need a hand to get on top of your farm's bushfire recovery, please reach out to us," Mr Miskimmin said.

Mr Miskimmin said the Farm Recovery Events were always a great week for all involved, with many jobs ticked off, laughs shared and friendships formed.

"The Farm Recovery week is an amazing experience for both our farmers and volunteers," he said.

The Farm Recovery Event runs from 3 March to 9 March 2024.





School Students Broadband Initiative

Do you know about the Australian Government's School Student Broadband Initiative powered by NBN Australia? The program has been extended, giving new families until 31 December 2024 to sign up. Act fast, and you could enjoy nearly 2 school years of free internet until 31 December 2025!

Eligibility:

- Have a child living at home that is enrolled in an Australian school.
- Do not currently have an active nbn network internet service at home (having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility).
- Live in premises that can access the nbn network through a standard connection.
- Have not had an active nbn connection during the previous 14 days.
